


ONCE UPON A TIME...



From Abraham's line (Gen. 22:18)

From tribe of Judah (Gen 49:10) (before 70 AD)

Born of a virgin (Gen. 3:15; Isa. 7:14)

Be preceded by a herald (Isa. 40:3-5)

Would be rejected and executed (Isa. 49:1-13; Is. 50:4-9; Is. 53; Ps. 22; Dan 9:26) despite innocence


Buried in a rich man's tomb (Isa. 53:9)







